

Indian Rock Trail



Wallowa-Whitman National Forest

This short scenic trail is located across from Union Creek Campground and goes to the top of Indian Rock. Once there you will find great views of Phillips Reservoir and the Black Mountain area.

Total Miles: 1.5 miles

Difficulty level: More difficult

Accessibility: The trail is steep in some spots, and non-accessible for disabled users.

Facilities and Attractions: It is best used in the late spring through late fall, and does not have any restroom facilities or designated trailhead parking. Across from the parking area is a fenced in area with the historic Chinese rock walls which were used during the gold mining era. No parking fee is required.

Directions: From Baker City, travel south on Highway 7 for *about* 17 miles to Forest Service 2225 road. This road is located before the turn-off to the Union Creek Campground. Turn right (north) on the FSR 2225 and go about 0.3 miles. Look for the small wooden sign on the tree designating the beginning of the trail on the right side (away from the creek). Parking is at the roadside turnout.
